Instead of a separate webpage, all of this information has now been implemented into the new website in the appropriate areas.

Communications

Since Nov 2019, CMUG has transferred its central location for file storing, sharing and transfer to a new SharePoint site which allows collaboration between internal and external partners. In parallel to the new SharePoint, a Microsoft Teams site has been set up to enable collaboration and more effective communication.
